Message from Fr Paul O'Neill

My dear sisters and brothers,

It was with great joy that the Diocesan community celebrated the ordination to the priesthood of Fr Graham Fullick at the Sacred Heart Cathedral on Saturday the 22nd February. Graham spent his teenage years in East Maitland parish before he went to university and then practised law in Sydney for many years. He completed his studies for the priesthood at the Beda College in Rome. Since returning to Australia Graham has been doing his pastoral placement as a deacon in Raymond Terrace parish and Myall Coast parish. It was with great joy that we welcomed Graham to celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at St Joseph's church East Maitland on Sunday 23rd February. Bishop Bill has appointed Graham to be the assistant priest at St Brigid's Raymond Terrace. We wish him every blessing in his priestly ministry.

Last Wednesday we began the season of Lent. These 40 days are an opportunity to renew our Christian life through prayer, fasting and helping others. On the first Sunday of Lent we have a visitor from the Philippines speaking at four of our parish Masses across the region. Through Project Compassion our Lenten sacrifices support many in our world who are in need.

Also on the first Sunday of Lent we have six catechumens who will be going to the Rite of Election conducted by Bishop Bill at the Sacred Heart Cathedral Hamilton at 2.30pm. All are welcome to join these catechumens, their sponsors and the baptised candidates from other Christian churches who will be received into full communion with the Catholic church at Easter time.

The Bishops of Australia have asked that when the Easter Triduum is celebrated, the three liturgies need to be led by a priest (that is, the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday; the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion at 3pm on Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening. The Bishops have stated that a stand alone Good Friday liturgy is not to be held when not part of a Triduum. However on Good Friday morning, each of the eight church communities can hold the Way of the Cross. I know there has been a tradition at Morpeth Parish and Largs church to hold a 3pm Good Friday liturgy. As from this year, that will no longer be possible, and I realise that some of our parishioners will be disappointed with that decision. I hope you can understand the reasoning behind the Bishops' decision. There will be three Easter Triduums held in the parishes of our region: one at Beresfield; one at East Maitland and one at Campbell's Hill. All eight church communities will have an Easter Sunday Mass.

I pray that this Lenten season will be a time of renewal for all of us as missionary disciples of Jesus Christ.

Welcome Lucy Sneesby-Tooth

My name is Lucy Sneesby-Tooth, I am the newly appointed Family Ministry Coordinator for the Chisholm, Upper Hunter and Vineyards regions. This position is to support the work of pastoral ministries in the diocese which is family- centred, parish based, and school supported. The points of connection with families occur in parishes, schools and the community through a variety of programs and formation experiences.

I am married to Tony who works in IT support at All Saints College. My three sons all reside with us in Rutherford. They are Lachlan 22, Alexander 20 and Cameron 14.

Originally from Lismore I was received into the Catholic church in 2010 through RCIA. My sons had always attended a Catholic primary school, each time they bought home the "To Know Worship and love" textbook I would read it cover to cover till the teacher requested I return it. It sparked a sense of curiosity within me. One Sunday morning I was walking to the Presbyterian Church I attended when my youngest son then 3 climbed up on the brick fence of the catholic church. I begged him to get down, but he just laughed and kept going. Cameron then smiled and said Look!! He ran towards the church doors, before I knew it, I was sitting in the back of the Catholic church. The following day I went to the primary school to talk to the REC about the church he then sent me to the parish office, and I enquired about becoming Catholic. The local church wasn't offering RCIA due to a lack of volunteers, but another parish is the area was going to offer it. I drove 40kms one way every Tuesday night with three sons in tow for months to complete RCIA.

I am an Oblate of St. Benedict; affiliated with Jamberoo Abbey on the south coast of NSW. An Oblate is a person who wants to make a deeper commitment to God by following the Christian journey in the way it is marked out by St. Benedict – that is, "with the Gospel for our guide".

I have a working background in legal, education and as a librarian though most recently I worked in learning support at St Bede's Catholic College.

I love coffee, reading, Latin Mass, research and study. I am currently completing my second qualification in Clinical Pastoral Education and a Graduate Diploma in Theology.

BUSHFIRE APPEAL



In the wake of the devastating bushfires which have resulted in lives lost, properties destroyed and much countryside razed to the ground, the response of the Australian community has been little short of inspiring.

In our local region, people have been extremely generous in supporting the Vinnies Bushfire Appeal. Many thanks to all.

Funds raised for the Bushfire Appeal amounted to 8500.00.

It is worth noting that early on some state politicians were critical of charities for not releasing funds quickly enough.

Interestingly, the same politicians later that week were defending the state government for being too slow in distributing funds.

You can be assured that, in the aftermath of the destruction wrought by the fires, the Society and its members were very quickly on the ground, drawing on its own funds to support those in desperate need, even before the Appeals were set up. Support included financial packages, essential items such as food, water, clothing and bedding, and emotional support for those affected.

While our own region was fortunate to escape the impact of the fires, I am aware of the destruction visited upon other areas such as Taree, and the support provided by our members in those areas. Our members and volunteers will stay alongside those people affected for the long months of recovery ahead.

Rest assured that every cent donated to the Vinnies Bushfire Appeal will go the bushfire victims. No administration fees are taken from the Appeal, meaning the money raised goes directly to the relief and recovery effort.

Vinnies is focused on doing what it has always done – assist people to rebuild their lives as they re-establish their home, their livelihoods and their spirit. Assistance will be provided during the difficult months ahead for those people who have lost everything.

The History of the Catholic Church in the Maitland Area Part 9

The Australian Catholic Directory For 1890 gives the following description of the Diocese of Maitland –

As established in 1848, the Diocese of Maitland consisted of the Borough of East Maitland only. By Papal Brief of 13th April, 1866, it was very much extended, and again by Papal Brief 10th May, 1887, it was reduced to its present limits.

Comprising the territory from Camden Haven to Red Head on the East Coast of NSW westward to Wallar and Cassilis on the west, to Murrurundi and a point 10 miles south of Mount Seaview on the north.

The diocesan boundaries remained unchanged from 1887 until 1^{st} January, 1966 when the Lake Macquarie district was added.

The 1890 directory gives the following description of the parishes, churches, and clergy, that encompasses what is today our Chisholm Pastoral Region.

WEST MAITLAND – Right Rev. Dr Murray, Very Rev. P. Hand, Rev. E. P. Sheehy, Rev. J. O'Donohoe, Rev. P. Roche, Very Rev. J. McGough, St John's Cathedral; Convent Church of Saints Mary and Laurence; St. Patrick's Lochinvar (used as church and school); St. Helen's, Gresford; St. Columba's, Paterson; Church of Sacred Heart, Summerhill; and four stations. Parochial schools, West Maitland, 400; Lochinvar, 75; Knockfin, 40.

EAST MAITLAND — Rev. P. O'Leary, St Joseph's, East Maitland; St. Patrick's, Brook's Flat. Parochial schools — East Maitland, 130; Dunmore, 80.

MORPETH – Very Rev. P. T. Corcoran (absent on leave), Rev. J. T. Clancy, St Bede's Morpeth (used as church and school). Parochial school, 160.

Before Bishop Murray set sail on his journey to Australia he had returned to Ireland in the hope of obtaining extra priests for his new Diocese. At the same time he arranged for a community of Dominican Sisters to follow him to Australia. Almost immediately upon his arrival in Maitland in October 1866, Bishop James Murray, was corresponding with the Dominican Sisters at Kingstown, Ireland, proclaiming 'you are wanted very badly here' and giving the sisters details of the preparations that had been made to accommodate and welcome them to Maitland.

The 1890 directory gives details of the **Religious Orders** in the Maitland area at that time –

Dominican Nuns founded from Kingstown, Ireland in 1867. Dominican Convent, West Maitland. Number in community 25. From Maitland other Dominican communities had been founded: Newcastle (1873), Tamworth (1875), Waratah (Deaf & Dumb Institution) 1889.

Sisters of Mercy founded from Ennis, County Clare, Ireland in 1875 at Singleton. Morpeth founded 1883, number in community 6; East Maitland founded 1885, number in community 5. Others Sisters of Mercy communities in the diocese: Singleton (1875), Murrurundi (1879), Raymond Terrace (1881), Musclebrook (1883), Lambton (1883), Hamilton (1884), Branxton (1880), Scone (1887).

Sisters of St Joseph founded from Bathurst, NSW in 1883. Convent Lochinvar founded 1883, number in community 11; Dunmore (Largs) founded 1889, number in community 3. Other Josephite communities in the diocese: Merriwa (1885), Cessnock (1886), Burwood (1888), Carrington (1888), Dungog (1889).

Opportunities for children's education had also grown as per the 1890 directory. *Superior Schools in our area:*

Sacred Heart College, West Maitland – 30 boarders, 25 day boys.

Dominican Convent-Boarding and Day School, West Maitland – 46 boarders, 40 day pupils.

Sisters of Mercy-Day Schools - East Maitland 7 pupils; Morpeth 11 pupils.

There were another 30 parish primary schools throughout the diocese with 2.830 children attending.

As more priests became available, the West Maitland and East Maitland parishes were subdivided into smaller parishes each with their own or shared Parish Priest.

Today with the decline in priestly vocations, the diocesan parish communities have again been drawn together and operate under various models. The Chisholm Pastoral Region operates under the Shared Parish Priest model and currently we have two resident priests who serve our communities. Our Chisholm Pastoral Region includes the parishes of St Joseph's East Maitland, St John the Baptist Maitland (with three mass centres – Sacred Heart Campbell's Hill, Holy Family Largs and St Columba's Paterson), Immaculate Conception Morpeth, St Patrick's Lochinvar, Our Lady of Lourdes Beresfield and St Paul's Rutherford.

Catholic education for both primary and secondary students is still in very high demand. Currently there are three secondary schools in the Maitland area with six feeder primary schools.



Saints and Feasts in March 2020



4/3/20. St Casimir was a prince of Poland; the third son of king Casimir IV. As a young man he refused to take up arms against any Christian country and also refused to marry the daughter of Emperor Frederick III. Instead he preferred a life of celibacy and devotion to God. In 1484 he died of tuberculosis at the age of 26. Soon after his death, miracles were reported at his tomb.

He is the patron saint of Poland and Lithuania.

6/3/20. Autumn Ember Day. Ember Days (from the German *Quatember*, 'quarter day', or, as the irish used to say, *Quarter Tense*) mark the beginning of each of the four seasons. Kept in the Roman church since the fifth century, they are observed in Australia on the first Fridays of Autumn and Spring as special days of prayer and penance.



7/3/20. Ss Perpetua and Felicity were martyrs of Roman Carthage, c.204. Perpetua was a young married woman with a newly born son. She was arrested for refusing to offer sacrifice to the Emperor and during this time was allowed to keep her son with her in prison. Also arrested was a slave-girl called Felicity, who was advanced in

pregnancy and gave birth to a girl while in prison. Perpetua and Felicity and several men were all found guilty of treason and were taken to the arena to be killed by wild beasts. Perpetua and Felicity showed great bravery and survived their encounter with a mad heifer, but at the request of the jeering

crowd were eventually put to the sword.



8/3/20. St John of God was originally a soldier who fought for Spain against the French and the Turks. Around the age of forty, he repented his former life and converted to a life of service to God. In 1539 he bought a house and gave shelter and care to the sick and needy. After his death, John's followers formed a

Religious Order of hospitalers, the Brothers of St

John of God. He is the patron saint of nurses, hospitals and the sick.

9/3/20. St Frances of Rome was born in 1384. Frances was forced into marriage and lived for forty



years as wife, mother and house-keeper before she was able to realise her dream of being a nun and ascetic. She established a community of laywomen who followed the Rule of St Benedict and ministered to the poor. Frances was a dedicated laywoman who in a time of plague and civil war, worked tirelessly for the poor and the sick yet without

compromising her love for her husband and family. Nursing her husband till his death, she them moved into the house with the other Oblates and was



superior for the four remaining years of her life. She died on this day in 1440.

17/3/20. St Patrick was born in Britain c.385 and as a young man was captured by Irish pirates and sold into slavery. After six years in Ireland he escaped, returned to his family and trained for the priesthood in Gaul. In c.435 he


returned to Ireland as a missionary bishop. Through his work, Christianity flourished and the church became organised. Although not extensively learned, St Patrick was known for his sincerity and pastoral care, and was largely concerned with abolishing paganism and idolatry and encouraged monasticism. There are many legends about Ireland's most beloved saint, including his use of the



shamrock for explaining the trinity, and his banishing of all snakes from Ireland.

18/3/20. St Cyril of Jerusalem was a distinguished theologian of the early Church (315-386). About the end of 350 AD he succeeded Maximus as Bishop


of Jerusalem, but was exiled on more than one occasion due to the enmity of Acacius of Caesarea, and the policies of various emperors. Cyril left important writings documenting the instruction of catechumens and the other of the Liturgy in his day. He is venerated as a saint by the Roman Catholic church, Eastern Orthodox church, Oriental Orthodox church and the Anglican communion. In



1883, Cyril was declared a Doctor of the Church by pope Leo XIII. He is highly respected in the Palestinian Christian Community.

19/3/20. St Joseph, the spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary and adoptive father of Jesus, was a descendant of King David and a carpenter by trade. During his betrothal to Mary he became distressed when he heard that she

was with child, but an angelic vision reassured him that this was all part of God's plan. After Jesus' birth he was warned in a dream to flee with his family to Egypt, in order to escape from King Herod.



Joseph showed great faith in his willingness to do whatever God asked of him.

23/3/20. St Turibius of Mogrovejo, a Spaniard, (born Mayorga 1538) served God from his infancy. Appointed Archbishop of Lima, he landed in South America in 1581. He died March 23, 1606, having, by his indefatigable zeal and by the boundlessness of his charity,

literally renewed the face of the Church of Peru. **Patron:** Peru, Latin American Bishops, Native Rights, (Also, Lawyers may seek his intercession because he was a Lawyer in Spain)

25/2/20. The Annunciation of the Lord. The feast of the Annunciation of the Lord celebrates Angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary (Luke 1:26-38) and his




announcement that she had been chosen to be the mother of the saviour of the world. Also being celebrated during this feast was Mary's *fiat*, which means "let it be" in Latin - her willing acceptance of the news, and immediately Christ was conceived in her womb through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Annunciation testifies powerfully to the truth of the Catholic tradition that Mary was indeed a virgin when Christ was conceived, but also that she intended to remain one perpetually.



































The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step Catholic devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on Earth as a man. The 14 devotions, or stations, focus on specific events of His last day, beginning with His condemnation. The stations are commonly used as a mini pilgrimage as the individual moves from station to station. At each station, the individual recalls and meditates on a specific event from Christ's last day. Specific prayers are recited, then the individual moves to the next station until all 14 are complete. The Stations of the Cross are

commonly found in churches as a series of 14 small icons or images. They can also appear in church yards arranged along paths. The stations are most commonly prayed during Lent on Wednesdays and Fridays, and especially on Good Friday, the day of the year upon which the events actually occurred.
