

Feedback of the Diocesan Synod to the Diocese of Maitland-Newcastle

Introduction

Our Diocese is currently undertaking a synodal journey listening to, dialoguing and discerning how God is calling us to be a Christ-centred Church. It involves two distinct but interrelated events - Plenary Council 2020 and the Diocesan Synod.

Background

The Plenary Council 2020, a formal gathering, has the highest level of legislative and governance authority with its resolutions binding on the Australian Catholic Church. The Diocesan Synod is a formal assembly of representatives of the Diocese convoked to advise the Bishop on matters concerning the good of the diocese, discern future directions, and frame our participation in the Plenary Council.

Session One of the Diocesan Synod was open, but it is possible that delegates drawn from across the diocese will be called to the Second Session. If that is the case others may be invited to attend as observers.

Diocesan Synod Working Party

The Council for Mission, a key strategic diocesan advisory group to the Bishop, has established the Diocesan Synod Working Party to organise the processes for the Diocesan Synod. It adopted the following planning model.

In order to address the tasks identified during Phase One Plenary Council and Session One of the Diocesan Synod the working Party identified the need for

- Four Diocesan Synod Focus Groups Foundational Guiding Principles, Discernment of Data, Diocesan Directory and Governance/Guiding Principles,
- Regional gatherings to discern the sensus fidelium, and
- Formation and reflection days.

These will assist in the preparation of the documentation for the Second Session of Synod, and in the formation of our people.
