When I was a boy I remember walking past my parents' bedroom before going to bed and saw my father kneeling beside his bed praying. It was very special to see my dad at prayer. In today's Gospel we witness Jesus praying to his heavenly Father and we hear what he said "I bless you Father Lord of heaven and earth for hiding these things from the learned and the clever and revealing them to mere children". In Jesus' prayer we learn that you do not have to have a degree in theology to understand God. The message



learn that you do not have to have a degree in theology to understand God. The message is simple. Jesus has revealed that God in our loving Father and we are all God's children.

Jesus in his humanity shows to us what our unseen God is like. Jesus welcomed sinners, he healed the sick and he challenged hypocrisy and injustice. Jesus then invited his followers when they were struggling with these beautiful words "Come to me all you who labour and are over-burdened and I will give you rest. Shoulder my yoke and learn from me for I am gentle and humble of heart and you will find rest for yourselves".

A yoke connected beasts of burden with each other or with the plough of the farmer. Jesus wants to be connected with us to help us in the field of our life.

In this time of the pandemic we know that there are many who are struggling with health issues, with isolation and with anxiety. May we as a Christian community be a light of encouragement to all those we meet. We do not have to carry the burdens of life on our own but Christ carries them for us. Therein lies our confidence and our hope.
