When evening came, he was there alone, while the boat, by now far out on the lake, was battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the

## HOMILY - 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A - Fr Maurice Cahill

An Anglican Scripture Scholar, Rev. Tom Wright, gives us this simple quiz: Of all the commands in the Bible, which do you think is repeated most often? Perhaps *Repent*; or *Do not judge*; what about *Love one another* – or *forgive* – or *do not doubt*? All of them are important he says, but none are repeated and impressed on us so much as *Do not be afraid*. Above all, that would mean our attitude to the Lord himself - always one of profound awe and homage. But our Almighty Lord does not want us to shrink away from him in a kind of terror when all the while he is reaching out to us with enduring love.

That brings to mind the story of the young male electrician in hospital, awaiting an imminent major surgery. He confided, "I am only really afraid of three things: AC, DC and JC." Perhaps we likewise would all share the young man's feeling of uneasiness that soon he could well be standing before his Saviour. Yet, the truth the Lord would have all of us hold on to is that his love is unearned; and that nothing can ever destroy that. No matter how unworthy or neglectful or sinful we may have been, nothing could ever make God change his mind about us. The merciful Lord would have us rise above our fears and make our peace with him.

In the gospel we read today, the apostles were finding it all fearful enough, trying to row a big awkward boat, miles out to sea, in the dark, at 3.00 am, caught in a fierce storm. But then, by the dim light of the lantern in their boat, they see a ghostly figure coming towards them – perhaps coming <u>for</u> them. That was real terror! Had their time ran out? It was Peter who rose above his panic, seeking his Lord. It must have taken every bit of Peter's remaining courage to answer Jesus' call *to "come; walk to me!"* But Peter's faith went wobbly as things got really rough. For their weak faith and trust they would all receive a scolding from Jesus.

And a soaking wet but happy Peter had learned a lot: that you never learn to trust until you survive the rough stuff. Or as true seafarers would put it: you never learn to be a clever sailor on a calm sea.

There is a call there for each one of us, too –to grasp hold of our faith in Jesus and seek to walk past our own fear, or even terror, at the thought of meeting our Judge and Saviour face to face.

And probably, as St. Matthew was writing his gospel, he knew that this storm story would mean a lot to the Christians of his own community, who were having a hard and dangerous time through persecution. They needed reassurance that Jesus was still with them and had not deserted them.

And again, for ourselves: in these times when 'our boat' is rocking wildly in the storm of scandal and moral failure, we need to be aware that Jesus is still with his Church. He urges us still not to be people of little faith.

Sometimes, pray as they might, it seems that God does not answer people's pleading. Or when tragic things happen, sometimes people ask what they have done to deserve it. There are those that 'throw a tantrum' and declare that they are "finished with God." Well, his ways are often incomprehensible to us. He is, after all, the Lord! And we must let God be God. He cannot be forced; we cannot '*twist his arm*', annoying as that might be. Caught *in life's storms*, we still do need to trust his love and closeness. He urges us not to be his people of little faith.
