


JARROD MUNRO SKINDEEP YEAR 7 SAN CLEMENTE HIGH SCHOOL

In some circumstances the only way to talk to family and friends is to go online with the technology we use every day. Through this technology we can stay connected with each other.




HANNAH RYDER SOLITUDE YEAR 7 SAN CLEMENTE HIGH SCHOOL



JODIE WILLIAMS CHANGE


YEAR 7 San Clemente High School
