

Vision and Mission Statement

Vision

The full, conscious and active participation of the faithful in liturgy, the source of the true Christian Spirit and all missionary endeavour.

[Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (SC) a. 14, 10]

Mission

To be of service to the diocesan community by engaging in dialogue that promotes a passion for the spirit of the sacred liturgy and an understanding of its principles and practice such that the celebration of the liturgy is appropriate for the community who gathers.

(SC a. 14, 17, 43-45)

Guiding Principles

- 1. The liturgical life of the Church is comprised of a rich feast of rites, ordered with Eucharist and the sacraments at the centre. (CSL a. 6)
- 2. Christ is always present in the Church, especially in its liturgical celebrations. (CSL a. 7) Liturgy is the work of Christ which takes place through the power of the Spirit. (CSL n. 6)
- 3. Every liturgy is a proclamation and celebration of the Paschal Mystery. (CSL n. 6, 26)
- 4. Liturgy is formational The liturgy is the primary and indispensable source from which the faithful are to derive the true Christian spirit. (CSL n. 14, 33)
- 5. Liturgy is a communal activity: the whole public worship of the Church, a celebration (action) of the whole Church. (GIRM a. 5) Its nature therefore is both communal and hierarchic. (CSL a. 7, 26-32)
- 6. People must be called to faith and conversion before they can come to the liturgy. (CSL a. 9)
- 7. The very nature of the liturgy requires the full, conscious and active participation of all the faithful as their right and responsibility by virtue of their baptism
- 8. Liturgy is sacramental in nature (CSL a. 33)
- 9. The liturgy achieves its intention (glorification and sanctification) through symbols (signs) perceptible to the senses and in ways proper to each of these signs. This work is signified through the liturgy's symbols (signs). (CSL n. 7)
- 10. Sacred Scripture is essential to the celebration of liturgy. (CSL n. 24)
- 11. Liturgy is the summit and the source of all the activity and power of the Church. (CSL a. 10) AND Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. (LG a. 11)

12. The Bishop is the chief liturgist of the diocese. (SC a. 41 and 45) The liturgical life of the diocese is centred around the bishop, especially when he presides at eucharist in the Cathedral. (SC a. 41)

Protocols and Practices

The *Diocesan Liturgy Council* (DLC) operates under the direction of the Bishop, according to the requirements of the relevant Church documents and in the light of its Statutes. The Council has developed its Stewardship Plan to support and enhance its particular form of service

- The Executive is elected in the middle of the year at the June or July meeting.
- The Council usually meets monthly from February to December inclusive
- The agenda is prepared by the Manager of Worship and Prayer in consultation with the Executive.
- All Council members may submit agenda items.
- o The agenda and meeting papers are distributed one week prior to the meeting.
- Minutes are distributed within a week of the meeting.
- o Minutes, or sections thereof, will be sent to non-Council meeting participants as appropriate.
- As appropriate council members participate in Diocesan Liturgy Forums, Working Parties and other groups the council establishes, and assist with formation opportunities
- All groups established by and accountable to the DLC are provided with appropriate documentation which outlines their mandate and responsibilities.

The Diocesan Liturgy Council -

- o Maintains links with state and national liturgical Councils
- o Consults with professional liturgists as necessary
- o Pursues ongoing formation
- o Maintains realistic expectations based on the skills and availability of its members and office staffing

DLC Profile

The *Diocesan Liturgy Council* has 8 appointed members: Allen Brierley (Assistant Master of Ceremonies), Monique Crick, Fr. Andrew Doohan (Master of Ceremonies), Fiona Duque, Uta France, Louise Gannon rsj (Diocesan Manager of Worship and Prayer), Anne Millard (Cathedral Director of Music), Cathy White, and an associate member – Ed Wright.

The Council works with the support of Liturgy Office which includes Louise Gannon rsj and Sharon Murphy who provides administrative support.

The Council's strength lies in the wide liturgical knowledge and experience shared by its members and the variety of perspectives they bring to the work of the Council including clergy and lay, male and female, city and country, parish and school, academic and pastoral.

The Liturgy Council also has responsibility for Christian Initiation (RCIA) in the diocese.
