SUBJECT: Changes to NSW Reopening Arrangements

Dear Colleagues

You will be aware that earlier this week the NSW Government announced further changes to the NSW 'Roadmap to Reopening' that will have a direct impact on parish life. I have attached to this Memorandum a copy of the information available from the NSW Government website which summarises the announced changes.

PLEASE NOTE: As at the time of writing, the Public Health Orders have not yet been amended. There is a chance that the advice contained below and in the attached document may not match any amendments to the Public Health Orders. If that is the case, additional information will be supplied as soon as available.

With effect from Monday 8 November 2021:

- A density limit of 1 person per 2 square metres applies to all locations, both inside and outside.
- Places of worship are not required to check vaccination status of attendees except in those cases outlined below.
- Updated COVID-19 Safety Plans may be required – please visit the NSW Government website closer to the time to have access to the latest version of the templates.
- Funerals are permitted with no person limit for fully vaccinated attendees (subject only to the above density limit).
- Funerals at which a non fully vaccinated person will be attending are limited to a 10-person limit, excluding the person conducting the funeral (i.e., a priest, deacon, or lay minister) or any person necessary for the conduct of the funeral (e.g., funeral director's staff, musicians, altar servers, etc).
- Weddings are permitted with no person limit for full vaccinated attendees (subject only to the above density limit).
- Weddings at which a non fully vaccinated person will be attending are limited to a 5-person limit, excluding those who are legally required to be present (i.e., celebrant, persons being married, two witnesses) and one person who is recording the event.
- Face masks remain mandatory in all indoor settings.

- Singing is only permitted for fully vaccinated persons. Therefore, it is strong recommended that communal singing not resume at this point. Up to ten fully vaccinated singers may sing in places of public worship and during religious services.
- The collection of contact details remains mandatory in all circumstances.

With effect from 95% Full Vaccination or 15 December 2021 (which ever comes first):

- A density limit of 1 person per 2 square metres applies to all locations, both inside and outside.
- Places of worship are open to everyone.
- COVID-19 Safety Plans will only be required in a limited range of circumstances.
- Funerals are permitted with no person limit for fully vaccinated attendees (subject only to the above density limit).
- Weddings are permitted with no person limit for full vaccinated attendees (subject only to the above density limit).
- Face masks are no longer mandatory in indoor settings except in very limited circumstances.
- Singing is once again permitted indoors with no limitations.

I am reliably advised that this Memorandum is No 57 since we first encountered COVID-19 in March 2020. I can only hope that there will not be too many more before I can give up on the process altogether.

Thank you for your continuing diligence and care in contributing to the health of our communities. I realise that there have been some very heavy burdens placed on parishes over the last twenty months, and while guarding against complacency, there is a end in sight.

People under the age of 16 who are not fully vaccinated are allowed unaccompanied in their workplaces and all outdoor settings, but must be with a fully vaccinated member of their household in hospitality venues (unless collecting takeaways), entertainment facilities and major recreation facilities. **Local government areas may be subject to different rules and restrictions in line with Public Health Orders.**
